## Flimby - The background



- Flimby is a small village in West Cumbria with a population of around 2000
- Identified in the top 10% most deprived areas in England
- High levels of anti-social behaviour
- Educational visits very sporadic

- Community Rail Cumbria working in partnership with Northern to support rail travel
- Community Rail Cumbria created a Strategic Alliance with Millom Discovery Centre
