### 'shopping list'

- Five or six new barrel planters and re-purpose existing five yellow grit bins (25 in total);
- Re-plant existing very large planters to reflect local flora and specify to local insects;
- Install three new taps for watering water butts unsuitable for use with open platform and cast-iron downpipes, position to avoid need for hosepipes (only got one tap!);
- Tiered wall rack planters to create 'green wall;'
- Three hazel trees in car park;
- Bug hotel(s);
- Create log-piles and pond in a pot nearby;
- Create well-being area with positive message signage;
- Limestone water feature or wooden sculpture;
- Wall-mounted planters & bird/bat nest boxes;




