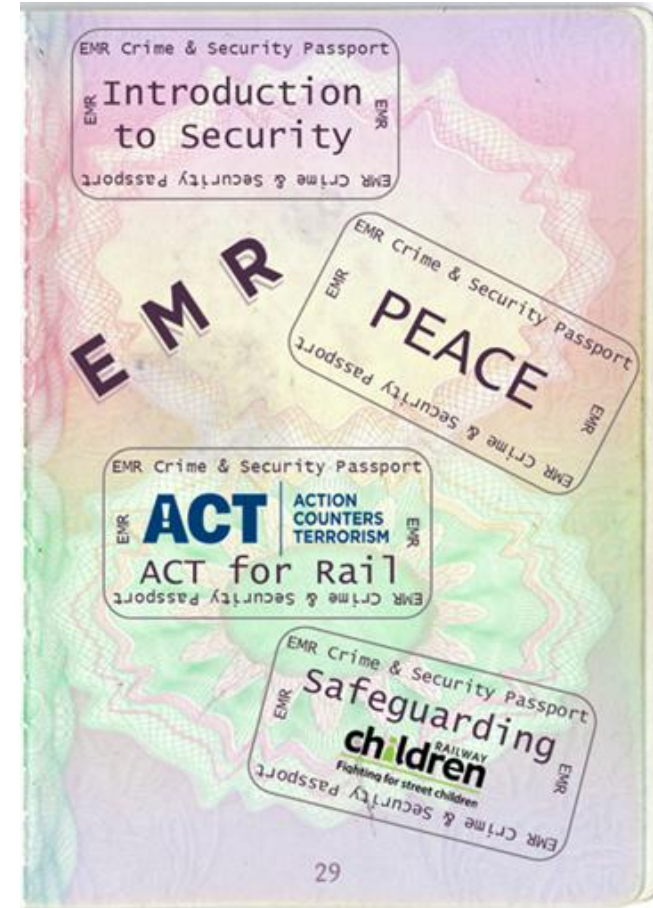

What results have we seen?

Background:

Railway Children's fieldwork, conducted primarily between December and February, revealed significant safety concerns near Tenter Lane, Mansfield. Their outreach identified repeated drug activity, discarded paraphernalia, and environmental neglect in an alleyway adjacent to the railway line. This location was subsequently linked to a serious rail safety incident involving a brick thrown at a moving train.

Actions:

- Targeted clean up – with all partners
- Hazard remediation – with local builders
- Comprehensive Risk Assessment – better lighting, CCTV, funding secured through Mansfield District Council Safer4all stream
- Drug Activity Monitoring – built a clear picture of the vulnerability of the space
- Youth Safety Concerns – allowed for increase visibility and engagement from local outreach services

What can we do more of/do better?

Funding availability

Increased education around travelling on train

Working with partners to create 'payback' for offenders

Increased networking – ensuring all stakeholders are involved

Training – looking at how we can do this with station adopters
