#### **'UTTOXETER HISTORICAL WALK' - WITH NORTH STAFFS CRP**

## Thursday 19 March, 12:00 at Uttoxeter > Depart Derby 11:26

Flexible return with an hourly train service to Derby leaving Uttoxeter at 13:14, 14:14, 15:14

Uttoxeter is one of those towns that often surprises people once they spend some time there. Famed for its racecourse, it continues to be full of market town charm. It also has a deeper history, being where Dr Samuel Johnson (the famous dictionary writer) stood bareheaded in the rain for hours as an act of penance for once refusing to help his father on the market stall (there's a statue marking the spot) and features several other interesting historic quirks.

This guided walk will start at the Railway Station, taking in the station gardens, artwork, and continuing through the historical town. At the end of the walk attendees will be able to visit Redfern's Cottage (small admission fee of £3), a fascinating living history museum, where participants are then welcome to take tea in the café, or to sample one of the towns many traditional pubs or microbreweries. The guided walk will be around ½ mile with return trips to stations self-led but guide on hand to offer assistance.

#### 'CROMFORD CANAL WALK' - WITH DERWENT VALLEY CRP

Thursday 19 March > Depart Derby by train at 10:49 > arriving back to Derby at 13:17 or 14:17

We will meet at Derby train station and travel to Whatstandwell station (arrive 11:12) to meet members of the local adopter group. This will be followed by a lovely 2 mile walk along the Cromford canal to Ambergate (arriving on foot at around 12:40), to meet the adopters there and hear about their community garden. If time allows we can also explore the railway heritage of Ambergate station.

Ambergate used to have 6 platforms over 3 stations but is now reduced to one platform. Return to Derby from Ambergate at either 12:59 (13:17) or 13:59 (14:17).

#### 'LONGTON BOTTLE KILN WALK' - WITH NORTH STAFFS CRP

Friday 20 March, 11:15 (duration - 90mins approx.)

Longton is the southernmost of Stoke-on-Trent's six towns and its second busiest shopping location. There were once 4000 coal fired bottle kilns in the six towns, today only 47 remain, of which 20 are in the town of Longton. This guided walk will take them all in, with the guide highlighting the role and significance historically, and explaining how industry shaped the Potteries.

The guided walk will be around 2 miles and take around 1.5 hours, starting and finishing at the station, with participants welcome to remain in Longton after the walk to visit other local attractions including Longton Victorian Market or take part in some retail therapy.
